Emergency Plan

The scenario of our village being isolated due to blocked roads, no power, limited communications, damaged homes and people requiring medical attention is a frightening one - but by preparing ourselves now it is something the village will be able to deal with

Catsfield Parish Council has put into place a Community Based Emergency Plan in order to enable the Parish to respond in an appropriate and effective manor to a major incident by assisting and supporting the District Council and the emergency services in harmony with their existing arrangements. Why have a Community Emergency Plan? Wide scale emergencies can and do happen. In the last 5 years the UK has seen events such as heavy snow, wide scale flooding, an oil depot explosion, terrorist attacks, utilities failures and fuel shortages.

The lessons learned from the 2007 floods showed that those communities which were prepared for emergency events were better equipped to deal with the impacts. This means that the individuals within those communities were able to cope without fear or panic.

Please find enclosed with this Newsletter your copy of the Emergency Plan to keep somewhere safe.

We all hope the above scenario never happens but if it did - then the Parish of Catsfield would be well prepared.

Cllr. Julian Goodliffe will be making a presentation of the Emergency Plan at the Annual Parish Assembly on Thursday, 26th April at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. Please feel free to come along and ask any questions.
