NOTES FOR COMPETITORS

- 1. Entries for the competition may be taken with entry money to any member of the committee listed on entry form before 6pm on Wednesday 31st July. Alternatively please take your entry forms with monies to the village hall, between 6.30pm and 8.00pm on that day.
- 2. Late entries are charged double and will only be allowed and at the organisers' discretion.
- 3. The programme for the Flower Show day will be:
 - 8.30am to 10.30am village hall open for the staging of entries
 - 10.30am hall closed for judging
 - 2pm to 4pm village hall open for viewing
 - 4.15pm award of cups and prizes
- 4. Bikini vases for flower entries will be available for hire on the day, but their use is not compulsory.
- 5. All baked items are displayed under plastic covers which are provided.
- 6. Bread rolls should be shown in a basket, loaves on a bread board, cakes on a white china plate with doily, and eggs in a basket.
- 7. Preserves should be shown with original sealed lid, commercial advertising on jars is not permitted. Fruit curd to have a wax seal.
- 8. Photographs can be digital or otherwise. They must measure between 6"x 4" & 8"x 6" and must be mounted on white card with a border of 1". The judge will apply these rules strictly.
- 9. Flowers and other plant material used in the decorative floral classes may be bought.
- 10. All judges are accredited and expert in their field. For details of standards, competitors are invited to consult the RHS handbook and the WI publication "On with the Show". Both books are to be found on the secretary's table on the day of the show and will also be available at the village hall on Wednesday 31st July, between 6.30pm and 8pm.
- 11. Only one exhibit per person per class.
- 12. Exhibits must not be removed from the show before 4pm.

Auntie Doris's Boiled Fruit Cake (recipe for class 50)

Place the following ingredients in to a large saucepan;

1 pound mixed fruit, 1 cup (8 fluid ounces) water, 2 teaspoonsful mixed spice, 4 ounces margarine, 1 cup sugar, 1 teaspoonful bicarbonate of soda.

Bring the saucepan to the boil, then turn off the heat and leave to cool for 1 hour.

Now add 2 cups plain flour, 1 teaspoonful baking powder, 2 beaten eggs and mix well. Place mixture in a greased and lined 8" round tin (or loaf tin equivalent). Bake at 160C for 1 1/2 hours approximately.
